Slogan and emblem determined for Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games

At the 27th Executive Board Meeting of the Organizing Committee held at Iris Aichi (Naka Ward, Nagoya City) on Monday, December 25, 2023, the following slogan and emblem were adopted for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games.

[Selection Process]

1st to 3rd Production Review Committee meetings

Four committee members (experts) discussed and considered the production policy and concept. The Selection Committee members were selected.

1st and 2nd Selection Committee meetings

Selection criteria and procedures were established, and evaluations were conducted by nine committee members, including athletes.

Interviews with people involved in the Para Games

To obtain a wide range of opinions to help with the selection of the slogan and emblem, interviews were conducted with people involved in the Para Games, including university students at two universities in the prefecture.

Host City Agreement for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games signed

On Tuesday, October 3, 2023, the Host City Agreement was signed by Aichi Prefecture, the City of Nagoya, the Asian Paralympic Committee (APC), the Japanese Para Sports Association/Japanese Paralympic Committee (JPC), and the Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games and Asian Para Games Organizing Committee (AINAGOC).



Athletes representing Japan did a great job at the 4th Asian Para Games (Hangzhou 2022)!

The 4th Asian Para Games (Hangzhou 2022) held in Hangzhou, Zhejiang Province, China from Sunday, October 22 to Saturday, October 28, 2023 was attended by about 3,000 athletes from 44 Asian countries and regions, and fierce competition took place in 22 sports. A total of 430 Japanese delegation members, including 259 athletes, participated in the Games and did very well.

At the closing ceremony, a video introducing the charms of Aichi and Nagoya and expressing the goal of diversity toward an inclusive society was shown. Moreover, the Asian Games flag was handed over to Mr. Hideaki Ohmura,


